

Five Things To Do If You Have Found A Dog



1. Check for a license or ID tag. No tags? Ask around your neighborhood in case the dog lives nearby.
2. Take the dog to the nearest veterinarian or shelter to have the dog scanned for a microchip and checked for a tattoo.
3. Notify all of the correct authorities to report the dog found. Call your local police (non-emergency line). Also, call your local animal control agency (ACO), to complete a found dog report or bring the dog to them if you are unable to keep the dog while searching for the his/her owner.
4. Create "found dog" flyers and post them around the neighborhood and at animal service businesses.
5. Post the dog on the lost and found section of your local craigslist, Nextdoor, in your local paper (found ads are often free) and on other lost and found Internet/Facebook sites.
